



Overseas Scholarships for Computer Science Postgraduate Programmes 2011 – 2012

Open to all new overseas applicants who have accepted a (un)conditional offer of a place on a full-time taught postgraduate programme in Computer Science or Information Technology for the academic year 2011–2012.

We are offering scholarships of £2,500 each (given as a non-cumulative reduction on the full overseas tuition fee payable). Criteria used for awarding scholarships will include academic merit and financial circumstances.
